## Dear Friends,

December 2022 marks the two-year anniversary of the founding of Papitto Opportunity Connection (POC), a private foundation dedicated to listening, building, and strengthening opportunities for Rhode Island's communities of color.

In our <u>early days</u>, we began by thoughtfully creating a foundation <u>board</u> entirely comprised of community members of color and representative of Indigenous, Latino, African American, Southeast Asian and South Asian backgrounds.

We slowly connected with leaders from across the state, having conversations in communities from <u>Conexión Latina Newport</u> to African Heritage conversations in Providence and Pawtucket to meetings at the <u>Center for Southeast Asians</u> and a gathering with Indigenous community members in Charlestown.

We learned so much in talking with people, hearing their stories and learning about their culture and understanding their challenges. One community member shared, "Progress moves at the speed of trust" and we took that to heart. We recognized early on that it was important to build trust in each community, and every day. I am hopeful we have done that.

In having community conversations, we understood that Rhode Island's communities of color struggle to launch and grow a small business; that organizations serving these communities are in a perpetual state of emergency; and we realized because they are working so hard, they rarely have the chance to connect with each other and learn how they might work together.

These community conversations directly impacted POC's direction and fundamental purpose in creating opportunities for communities of color with a particular focus on non-traditional programs focused on education, job skills training and entrepreneurship.

Throughout the last two years we have supported more than 150 RI non-profit organizations. We have committed \$60 million to non-profits, which in turn goes back into

the state's economy.

Together with leaders in RI's communities of color, we have created <u>small business loan programs</u>, expanded <u>financial literacy</u> offerings, grown mentorship programs for young and older people, enhanced support systems for <u>higher education</u> for first generation college students, established the <u>Transform RI Scholarship Program</u>, created high paying <u>job opportunities in the medical field</u>, invested in <u>music</u> and <u>art education</u>, swimming lessons and <u>golf instruction</u> for youngsters in urban core cities, and fostered <u>opportunities for food entrepreneurs</u> of color to name a few.

We held our first annual POC <u>Connector Conference</u>, bringing together more than 120 non-profit entities to collaborate and share. And this past summer, more than 65,000 people celebrated Rhode Island's beautifully diverse community of artists, performers, food vendors and non-profit organizations during the POC at WaterFire event.
