

Celebrating Black History Month

February is <u>Black History Month</u>, a time to recognize and showcase the achievements, challenges and sacrifices made by African Americans who have helped develop and strengthen this country. This month, we are highlighting some of our community partners that are making a huge impact and breaking barriers for communities of color in Rhode Island.

In order to move forward, you have to look back.

Take a step back in history and experience the <u>RI Black Heritage Society</u>'s latest exhibit "Before Malcolm & Martin: The Fight for Civil Rights in RI, 1865-1968." <u>Martin Luther King</u> <u>Jr</u>. and <u>Malcolm X</u> were pivotal leaders during the Civil Rights Movement of the 1960s. However, men and women in Rhode Island were fighting for civil rights long before these leaders were born. This new exhibit explores the seminal role that Rhode Islanders, like the <u>Reverend Mahlon van Horne</u> and restaurateur, <u>George T. Downing</u>, played, advocating for civil rights for people of color in the state after the Civil War to the mid twentieth century.



Everyone loves to hear a good story. Storytellers pique our curiosity, offer cultural understanding and experiences, explore different worlds, countries, history, and traditions while often teaching valuable lessons.

The <u>RI Black Storytellers</u> (RIBS) have been doing this for 25 years. The organization strives to share cultural values, history, awareness and the application of Black storytelling through performances, workshops, cultural, educational, and historical experiences. Throughout the year, RIBS offers workshops in storytelling, writing, and related arts as a part of the development of the next generation of storytellers along with professional development workshops for those interested in enhancing cultural awareness and improving their performances and communi-



cation skills.



All these elements come together to create the organization's <u>FUNDA FEST</u>: A *Celebration of Black Storytelling*. This year's theme, *Sankofa*, encompasses taking from the past what is good and bringing it into the present to make progress in the future.

Visit the <u>Stages of Freedom African American Museum</u>, view the exhibits of Rhode Island African American history and learn the remarkable stories of some of Rhode Island's influential African Americans, including opera singer Sissieretta Jones, Providence's Black Victorian-era power couple Edward and Christiana Bannister, Newport caterer <u>George T</u>. <u>Downing</u>, and entrepreneur <u>Eleanor Eldridge</u>. Stop by the museum gift shop or join historian Ray Rickman on a walking tour of Providence's East Side, where the history of African Americans is written in its buildings.
