Grantmaking: POC Million Dollar Innovation Challenge

Organizational Background

The Papitto Opportunity Connection (POC) is a non-profit private foundation dedicated to listening and working together with non-profit organizations in Rhode Island supporting diversity, equity and inclusion. It is POC's mission to empower and create individual success stories by investing in programs designed to create systemic change for Rhode Island's communities most in need.

Rhode Island is a state of 1 million people, and because of our size, we have a unique opportunity to accomplish our goals through aggressively funding unique and sometimes out-of-the-box programs. Operating on a model of trust-based philanthropy, we are constantly learning based upon active community participation and engagement.

Project Description

POC is seeking proposals from Rhode Island-based 501(c)(3) non-profits designed to support programming that will create systemic change for communities most in need in Rhode Island in the areas of education, skills training, business, healthcare, and housing. The Papitto Opportunity Connection Million Dollar Innovation Challenge will award two (2) \$1 million grants during this competitive RFP process.

Organizations applying for these grants are *strongly encouraged* to collaborate with other 501(c)(3) non-profits to leverage resources and cultivate partnerships. The organizations selected for these grants will have the opportunity to apply for addition funding from POC in the future, but organizations should not count on future funding as it is not guaranteed.

Grantmaking Limitations

There are several categories of activities that POC does not fund under any circumstances which, are:

- building construction
- capital campaigns
- lobbying of government entities
- political campaigns or events
- endowments
- programs that do not primarily benefit people inside the State of Rhode Island

Also, POC does NOT allow fiscal sponsors for grantmaking.

Grant Eligibility

- Open to all Rhode Island-based organizations with tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Service Code and that are in good standing with the Rhode Island Secretary of State.
- Programs seeking funding, whether new or existing, must be focused on serving Rhode Island's communities most in need.
- An organization that previously received a POC grant must be current on all reporting. If the organization's report is not yet due, an interim report summarizing the progress of the grant must be included in this application.

RFP Requirements and Timeline

- The RFP process will open on June 1, 2024.
 - Applications are due by 11:59 pm on Monday, June 17, 2024 and must be submitted online via the portal on the POC website at https://pocfoundation.com/ Applications provided directly to a POC trustee, advisory board member, or the director of grants and public relations will NOT be considered.
 - o Incomplete or late applications will not be considered.
 - All applications must be signed by the person writing the grant and by an executive-level member of the organization.
